



Bio - Tony Vaughan – National Vice President

Tony was brought up in a traditional Catholic home being one of seven children. He had two aunts that were nuns (one was very charismatic) and one uncle who was a priest. After leaving school, Tony spent six months in a surveying team and then left to join the New Zealand Army when he was seventeen years old. Tony's primary role was that of a Chief Administrator working with all army units. Tony spent twelve years in the service and was a paratrooper with the 3rd Task Force Ready Reaction Force which could be deployed anywhere in the world with 48 hours' notice. Tony is married to Roberta and they have 3 adult children.

Tony left the army as Senior Non Commissioned Officer and took over the role of Office Manager for a large freezing works (1,400 men and women) where he was responsible for all the stores, payroll, administration personnel, works butcher shop, works cafeteria and budgets. From here Tony went on to manage and consult for legal firms for the next 23 years both in New Zealand and Australia.

Tony is currently the General Manager of a legal practice in Rockhampton, Queensland and an Associate Fellow of The Australian Institute of Management.
