Over the last year the Lord has strongly impressed upon me the absolute importance of time, and the brevity of life.

James 4:14 reminds us that 'you are just a vapour (or mist) that appears for a little while and then vanishes away'. The Bible also compares our lives to a flame, or to grass that burns up in the heat of the day. The images are of the shortness of life, and its transient nature.

We also know that we bring nothing into this world, and that when we depart we will take nothing (physical) from it. It stands to reason then that in the final analysis all we have in between is the time God has given us.

We all know stories of men or women who have been given just months to live by the doctor and have changed their lifestyle. They might make time to enjoy the beauty of God's creation, to fulfil a long held dream or ambition and to spend time with those most important to them, strengthening relationships. These people know in a very real way the importance of time

Yet I think that most of us, myself included, generally live as if time isn't that important. Jobs, cars, houses, things, recreation and sports, seem to fill our imaginations – and society says to us that accumulating these is the measure of success. So we spend our time chasing or acquiring these things, little realising that we are constantly trading away the only thing we have of any value – time.

Moses says in Psalm 90:12 'So teach us to number our days that we might present to Thee a heart of wisdom'.

That is what God has impressed upon me. Number my days! Today is all I have because yesterday has gone and cannot be reclaimed. Tomorrow has not, and for me, may not arrive. There are no guarantees about tomorrow, so I must make the most of each hour of today. That is easy to say and a lot harder to do.

Bio - Ian Smith (National Secretary)

Ian immigrated to Australia from England with his parents along with a sister and two brothers in 1974. The family settled in Strathpine, and after he finished school he worked at Alcan for a short time before finding a job working as a clerk in the Royal Brisbane Hospital. During this time, he became very influenced by the people he worked with and found himself frequenting night clubs and partying, often not going home between shifts but spending the night drinking with mates. Even after Ian left the hospital to work as a supervisor at the Golden Circle Cannery he continued this same lifestyle. Ian also had friends who were musicians. These friends of his played in pubs, and so Ian would also spend time with them. He had learnt to play the guitar at this time, but never performed with them. He would just go to watch (and drink).



It was in April 1983 that Ian was first introduced to the gospel after his parents received Christ. His conversion was very dramatic. It was as if he had been walking in one direction and in an instant was facing the other way walking in the opposite direction. The drinking stopped. The swearing stopped. His records were burnt, and he started reading the Bible.....constantly.

The afternoon before he committed his life to God, he had been at the local pub where his friends were playing. They wondered why he wasn't drinking, but it was because he had promised his mother that he would go to church that night just to keep her happy, and he didn't want to smell like alcohol. He never went back to the pub. His conversion was so dramatic that in November of that year he was in India sharing the gospel, playing his guitar, and praying for the sick. If he hadn't already been totally transformed in his faith (which he was), this certainly would have done it as he laid hands on the lame, deaf and blind and saw them healed in Jesus name.

During this year, Ian also met his wife Sue at church. They were married in 1984. Ian and Sue have four children — Benjamin, Joshua, Cherie-Ann and Amy. Today, all are involved in separate churches and they are all serving the Lord in different ministries. In 1995, the Lord started to talk to Ian about starting a business producing plastic packaging. Ian had learnt about the processes involved with vacuum formed packaging at Pacific Products (Int.), the business that he was then employed at. Ian had no business background which may make it sound like a risky thing to do, but he did have enough knowledge of the manufacturing processes involved to be able to run a business if he knew that God was with him.

However, Ian did not want to do the wrong thing with his employer, and therefore told God that he would have to make the way open if he was going to proceed down that path. This is exactly what happened. While Ian continued working for Pacific Products, Shiloh Plastics began operating in 1996 under Ian and Sue's house with complete support of Pacific Products. Eventually, Ian went full time running this business, which today occupies a 650m factory and employs 7 staff. Ian and Sue still attend the same church where they met and have been actively involved in many ministries over the years including music ministry, Sunday school and youth. Ian also preaches from time to time. Ian is passionate about seeing people reach their full potential as they grow in 'the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ:' (Ephesians 4:13)
