In reading 2 Samuel, Chapter 5 I find great inspiration because I see parallels in it with what God is doing in our FGBMFI fellowship today. I note that David was thirty years old when he began to reign over what was once a divided kingdom and that there were still those who resisted him, such as the Jebusites who dwelt in Zion (then named Jebus after the defiant Jebusites who opposed King David). The Jebusites considered the natural defences of their citadel impregnable. <u>Witnessing</u>



'My coffee & conversation with James:' ... from Ron Oastler.

It had been quite a few weeks since James and I had been together, so it was no surprise to have him call my mobile and suggest that we meet the next day for coffee. So the next morning we got together at an up-market café on the Promenade, looking out at the passing parade of locals and holiday-makers. Nice...and the coffee was nice too.

'So, what has the Lord been saying to you since we last met?' He casually asked (casual, yes, but with intent!).

'Well...'I began, 'I have been troubled by the question of 'why some people seem to be reluctant to share their faith'. It seems that nobody knows that they have committed their lives to Christ, that they are born-again, even that they go to church. There is a huge potential for the Gospel if we can release them from whatever is holding them back.'

'Yes,' James readily acknowledged, 'there are a lot of 'invisible Christians' – and you are quite right about the impact if these folk could be energised to share their faith. There must be answers. Yes? To what conclusions have you come so far?'

Encouraged to give him my thoughts, I went on: 'Quite some time ago I had the privilege of running a few 'Soul Winning' seminars with FGBMFI in New Zealand. At that time we talked about three things that stop people from witnessing: i) Indifference, ii) Inhibition and iii) Inability – with the answers being

the need for

i) Having a Vision

ii) Having the anointing of The Spirit

iii) Learning How.'

With a further word of encouragement for me, James commented: 'That certainly is very good – and each of those needs to be covered in any teaching and training sessions for the revitalised 'FGBMFI Australia' members. Well done. There is of course another element in the equation – an element we might call the prologue to the play. It really is very simple:

'i) really knowing Christ (and remembering how we came to Him) –

ii) Knowing His blessing in our life (and the relevance of this sort of blessing in other folk's lives)

iii) Then sharing what we know and have experienced.'

'A great example of this of course, was at the healing of the demon possessed man in Gadara.' James noted. 'The man who was healed wanted to go straightway with the Lord, 'but Jesus did not allow him, but said to him, Go to your house, to your own, and report to them what the Lord has done to you and had mercy on you. And he went and began to proclaim in Decapolis what Jesus did to him. And all marvelled. (Mark 5:19-20.')

'Well thank you...' I said, 'that provides a great connection with what was in the back of my mind, from The Apostle Peter:

"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you of the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect. **1Peter 3:15.**"

I remembered hearing this comment some years ago

"If you were arrested for being a Christian would there be enough evidence to convict you?"

FGBMFI Business Tips

THE NEW LEADER'S FIRST 100 DAYS -

Whether you're a new CEO, a new team leader, or the President of the U.S., the pressure to descend from the mountain and present the Tablets of Truth can be overwhelming. It is also a trap. The first thing you ought to do if you're the new person in charge is *nothing*!

Resist the temptation to 'Hit the Ground Running.' It is almost certain to be wrong. One, you don't know as much as you think you know. And if you start off by imposing your views on people, you're not going to have what you most need when you most need it - namely the commitment of the people you need to get the work done. A new leader is in a temporary state of incompetence.

Your most important tool is an open and questioning mind and manner. It's your one chance to ask stupid questions!

EIGHT RULES (AN AGENDA FOR THE FIRST 100 DAYS)

1. LISTEN

Ask open-ended questions and force yourself to listen, really listen, to what they say. That means not talking.

- 2. <u>RESIST THE SAVIOUR SYNDROME</u> This is not the time to announce a bold new strategy or 'vision.'
- 3. <u>KEEP IT SIMPLE</u> When people are deluged with long lists of priorities and action plans, their eyes glaze over and inaction reigns. But when they are given a couple of concrete priorities wrapped inside a clear and simple theme, they can move ahead with purpose, leaving room for individual imagination and experience to fill in the details.
- 4. <u>HIT PAUSE</u>

When posed with a good question wait a beat. If you don't have the answer, promise to get back to them, and then do so.

- LOOK FOR QUICK WINS If you can find a few things that were serious flaws in the organisation and fix them quickly, you can establish your credibility as a leader very fast.
- <u>SPELL</u> IT <u>OUT</u> Use your early management meetings to do more than meet and greet; this is the time to establish what you expect of them, to communicate your management philosophy, and to set the tone–it'll be hard to reset it later.
- 7. <u>DON'T DISS</u> YOUR <u>PREDECESSOR</u>

People forget that just about everyone who is there when the new leader arrives has worked for the old leader and probably has some loyalty to him or her.

GIVE FEEDBACK By synthesizing what you learn and communicating it to the organisation. You give your workers an ownership stake in the new agenda and improve your chances for broad-based support.



According to the Fed's, Michael Franzese, son of N.Y.'s legendary Colombo Family Underboss John "Sonny" Franzese, was the biggest money earner for the Mafia since Al Capone. A 1986 Fortune Magazine cover story titled, "The 50 Wealthiest and Most Powerful Mafia Bosses," ranked Franzese number 18. At 34, he was by far the youngest on the list.

Referred to by the media as, "*The Prince of the Mafia*" and the "*Yuppie Don*," he was reputed to be a "*rising star*" in the family, destined to become boss one day. At the height of his career, he was generating \$6-8 million a week masterminding legal and illegal activities that included a gasoline distribution network that sold a half-billion gallons a month, a gambling operation that impacted athletes, union racketeering, auto dealerships and feature film production. His holdings included millions of dollars, several homes, a helicopter, lear jet, and luxury boats.

So intricate were his activities, the justice department organized a 15 man multiagency task force comprised of federal, state and local officials, with the sole purpose of bringing down the mob's most prolific young star. Famed Manhattan U.S. Attorney Rudolph Giuliani led one of five prosecutions of Franzese, none of which after lengthy trials resulted in convictions. Law enforcement remained undaunted, however, and was determined to bring him down.

The mob life is a turbulent one, filled with treachery and deceit. At a relatively young age, Franzese appeared to be very adept at navigating the often dangerous waters of La Cosa Nostra, and insulating himself from law enforcements ever expanding web while increasing his power and influence along the way. But, God had another plan for Franzese. And it began on the set of a movie Franzese was producing in south Florida titled, "**Knights of the City.**" The cast included Sammy Davis Jr., Smokey Robinson and a beautiful, 19 year old dancer from Anaheim, California --- Cammy Garcia.
